The UK FIM+FAM is designed for measuring disability in the brain-injured population. It has an ordinal scoring system for all 30 items from 1-7 (1=complete dependence and 7 fully independent). Scoring is conducted at 2 time points - approximately 7-10 days after admission (admission score) and within 7 days of discharge (discharge score).

FIM Score Percentage Calculations for ADLs. 7 Complete Independence (timely, safely) 6 Modified Independence (device) 5 Supervision (cuing, setup, coaxing) *4 Minimal Assist (Patient participation= 75% or more) *3 Moderate Assist (Patient participation= 50% - 74%) *2 Maximal Assist (Patient participation= 25% - 49%) *1 Dependent (Patient participation= less than 25%)

Activities of Daily Living. Eating: Includes the use of suitable utensils, bringing food to mouth, chewing and swallowing once presented on table or tray, drinking from cup or glass.

Fun With FIMS: GROOMING

Score "R" and "S" only if the client uses a wheelchair. Check: manual wheelchair motorized wheelchair R Wheel 50 feet with 2 turns Once seated in wheelchair/scooter, can wheel at least 50 feet and make 2 turns. S Wheel 150 feet Once seated in wheelchair/scooter, can wheel at least 150 feet in corridor or similar space.

Self-Care and Mobility Section GG Items

A common error is when clinicians juxtapose the scoring guidelines for the six different items—eating, grooming, bathing, dressing the upper half of the body, dressing the lower half of the body, and toileting—with other items on the FIM.

Conquer scoring self-care on the FIM instrument - www ...

The FIM instrument comprises 18 items, each of which is assessed against a seven-point ordinal scale, where the higher the score for an item, the more independently the patient is able to perform the tasks assessed by that item. Total scores range from 18 to 126.

ADMISSION DISCHARGE FOLLOW-UP

Score of 4 - Minimal Assistance (Patient performs 75% or more of task) Score of 5 - Setup / Supervision (Patient performs task with cueing, coaxing or setup assistance) Score of 6 - Modified Independence (Patient performs task with assistance of a device or medication)

Rehabilitation Nursing: Functional Independence Measure (FIM)

The patient requires prompting (slowed speech rate, use of repetition, stressing particular words or phrases, pauses, visual or gestural cues) less than 10% of the time. 4 Minimal Prompting—The patient understands directions and conversation about basic daily needs 75 to 90% of the time.

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
