Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) at 1.5 Tesla or less is safe in all trimesters of pregnancy. The safety of MRI at 3.0 T has not been proved and pregnant patients should be imaged at 1.5 T or less. 1,9 Intravenous gadolinium for MRI is an FDA class C agent and should not be given in pregnancy.

Introduction. Fusion of the müllerian ducts normally occurs between the 6th and 11th weeks of gestation to form the uterus, fallopian tubes, cervix, and proximal two-thirds of the vagina (1).Any disruption of müllerian duct development during embryogenesis can result in a broad and complex spectrum of congenital abnormalities termed müllerian duct anomalies (MDAs).
